

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## Central Area Treasurer Updates

- Review the LINKS FINANCIAL CALENDAR in the FINANCIAL HANDBOOK-June 2020 (page ii), and the Member Management System User Manual (referred to as MMS or IMIS).
- By now, based on your chapter's gross receipts the following should already be completed:
   --Annual Treasurer's Report, Internal Audit <u>AND</u>, if applicable

--An External Financial Review **OR** a Full External Audit (see pg. 10 – Financial Manual)

- On or before September 15, 2023 (EST), your Chapter should be submitting:
  - 990, 990-EZ, or 990-N Tax Form to the IRS, <u>with</u> a copy uploaded to The Links, Incorporated via MMS; OR an extension request.
  - 2. Internal Audit Certification Form (see Appendix A-14) along with the Chapter's Annual Treasurer's report (Appendix A-5) via MMS; and
  - 3. External Financial Review or Full External Audit (if required, based on gross receipts).
  - 4. Chapter Bonding Insurance. [no extensions allowed on this submission] (Appendix A-13)
- Reminder that your Internal Audit Chair and Chapter Treasurer will submit the information online with YOUR approval required in MMS to National Headquarters. <u>All sign-offs in MMS must be completed</u> by September 15<sup>th</sup>.
- There are <u>chapter fines</u> associated with missing the September 15<sup>th</sup> deadline. All fines are outlined in the FINANCIAL HANDBOOK (see Appendix A-12).
- Chapter financial documents should be transitioned to new Chapter Treasurer by outgoing Treasurer by end of September (preferably by September 15th).







## Strategic Planning Updates



The Strategic Planning Committee encourage presidents to view the strategic plan as integral to the chapter's operations, what it does and how it does it.



Our national organization has indicated that each chapter of The Links, Incorporated, <u>shall</u> have an active Strategic Plan.



#### The Strategic Planning Committee's goals include:

By April 2024, increase to 100% the number of chapters inputting a strategic plan into the Global Strategic Planning Portal.

Increase to 100% the number of chapters updating their strategic planning goals for each required update of October 31<sup>st</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup> each year.

By 2025, increase to 100% chapters having at least one goal aligned to each of the five national priorities using the Central Area's Strategic Planning Template as a tool to improve this process.










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## Technology Committee Goal:
